entertained at a reception at their home following the ceremony. Guests were greeted at the door by Mr. and Mrs. George Moss, paternal aunt and uncle.

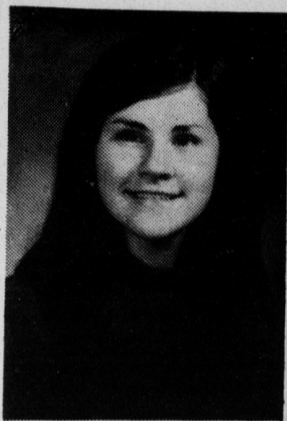
