James Turner was elected vice president of VICA District Six. Tommy Berry took first


place in the district in the bricklaying contest.

"Our goal is to be number

one in sports," says Cornwell. "We were the only AM station on the dial back in March carrying the entire Atlantic Coast Conference basketball tournament.

"If there is enough interest in a sports event, we carry it. Sports is one of the best selling tools for our customers. And we have loyal sponsors that believe in us.

"We carried only Red Raider basketball games to start with last year but discovered there tremendous interest in the Raiderettes so we also started carrying their games later in the season. And we followed them all the way in the Southwest 3-A Tournament and the WNCHSAA event. South Point girls athletics has also been tremendous.

"It's good to be carrying a winner. South Point has had four WNCHSAA titles in the last three seasons and almost
