Starting in the sixth grade in August, Deal begins recruiting students. As he recruits students, Deal also begins relating each instrument to the student. By doing this, he is able to assemble a performing band group familiar with the musical instruments and their working. This process continues into the seventh grade.

Around December, Deal is working heavily with the eighth grade band and joins them with the ninth graders. This helps to iron out any weak points.

Deal noted that tenth, eleventh and twelfth graders are the strictly performing band. These are

the students who represent the school and city in parades, and perform at football games and graduation exercises.

The band known as the Blazer Band (because the students wear blazers in the school colors) performs in competition in all state band contests.

At the meeting Deal arranged a selection of numbers for the flutist, explaining that the flute is very important to good band music but is seldom heard as a single. The audience enjoyed the flute performance rendered by Barbara Harper, Jane Campbell, Sissy Smith and Elizabeth Eaker.

Mrs. McClure then introduced two of her choral groups. She presented David Lucas who sang "A Time For Us" and "Old Man River" and

Brantley Mercer who rendered "My Way" and "Land of Hope and Glory".

The two were recently chosen from a select group to go to Rumania to the Rotary Music Camp. While there they work with the Westminster

Choir and spend three weeks in Rumania. Both juniors, they have received the Kiwanis Scholarship Award in music.
