ORDER AUTHORIZING \$105,000 GAS SYSTEM

BONDS

BE IT ORDERED by the Board of Commissioners of the City of Kings Mountain: 1. That, pursuant to The Local Government Bond Act, as amended, the City of Kings Mountain, North Carolina, is hereby authorized to contract a debt, in addition to any and all other debt which said City may now or hereafter have power or authority to contract, and in evidence thereof to issue Gas System Bonds in aggregate principal an amount not exceeding \$105,000 for the purpose of providing funds, with any other available funds, for enlarging and improving the gas system of said City, including the construction of a peak shaving plant and appurtenant facilities and the acquisition of any necessary land, rights of way and equipment.

2. That taxes shall be levied in an amount sufficient to pay the principal of and the interest on said bonds.

3. That a sworn statement of the debt of the City has been filed with the City Clerk and Treasurer and is open to public inspection.

4. That this order shall take effect 30 days after its publication following adoption, unless it is petitioned to a vote of the people as provided in G.S. 159-60 in which event the order will take effect when approved by the voters of the City at a referendum as provided in said Act.

The foregoing order has been introduced and a sworn 7-10-31 statement of debt has been filed under The Local Government Bond Act showing the appraised value of the City of Kings Mountain, North Carolina, to be \$83,585,499.00 and the net debt thereof, including the proposed bonds, to be \$3,505,000.00. 
