Hamrick, a local realtor, commented that he considered the project a throughway instead of a by-pass and declared "this project is of great benefit and reflects much growth. This moves a lot of sub-standard housing that would not have been moved if the highway didn't displace it."

To a question, Shull said a total of 600 individual right-of-ways had been secured by his office for secondary road projects with a total of 780 active primary claims.

Daves reportedly told him that he had been driving from a party in the Kings Mountain the night of the incident and would have passed the King and Watterson street intersection at the approximate time of the accident. According to Dodge, Daves said it was misty and dark and he hit an object and saw a flash and thought it might have been an owl."

Bridges, who also took the stand, said he was unconscious for 10 days after the accident and couldn't remember anything about it.

Daves is free on \$500 bond. His Superior Court trial date has not yet been set.

Realtor Moving Offices

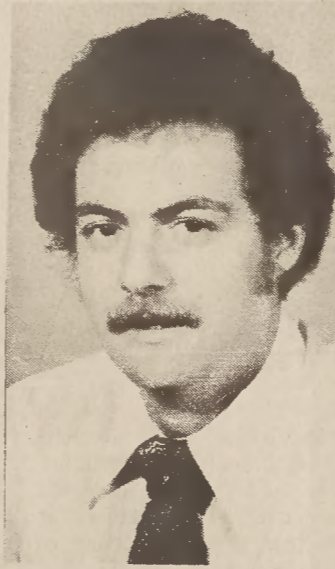
Jerry King has moved his real estate offices to 213 Fulton St.
