Schiele Museum To Sponsor Rafting Trip And King Tut Exhibition

The Schiele Museum is sponsoring a whitewater rafting trip on the Nantahala River Aug. 18, according to Robert Bell, museum representative.

"The Nantahala is a good family rafting river," Bell said, "not terrifically violent. For this reason it is the most heavily used river in the state."

The Schiele's expedition is open to all interested persons, including 12-year olds accompanied by an adult. But, Bell warns, all participants must be in good health.

Bell said the rafting trip will take place rain or shine and suggests rafters wear comfortable clothing library Sun., Aug. 12 at 3 suitable for being doused shorts, bathing suit and, preferrably, sneakers.



"Each person should bring a complete change of clothing and a hefty box lunch," Bell said. "Transportation is not being provided. All par-

The Schiele Museum of Natural History will feature "Tut And More," through Aug. 31, according to Alan Stout, director.

Stout said the exhibit is on loan from the Statesville Museum of Art and Science. There is also art and artifacts from private collections of Mrs. Louise Moss, Mr. and Mrs. Fred Moss and Mr. and Mrs. Paul Kincaid from the neo and ancient Egyptians.

"The Schiele's staff artist, Chip Holton, has fashioned a tomb which is as much a part of the display as the artifacts themselves," Stout said. "This includes paintings and carvings of Egyptian hieroglyphics and dieties. its entrance is a
