Family Reunion

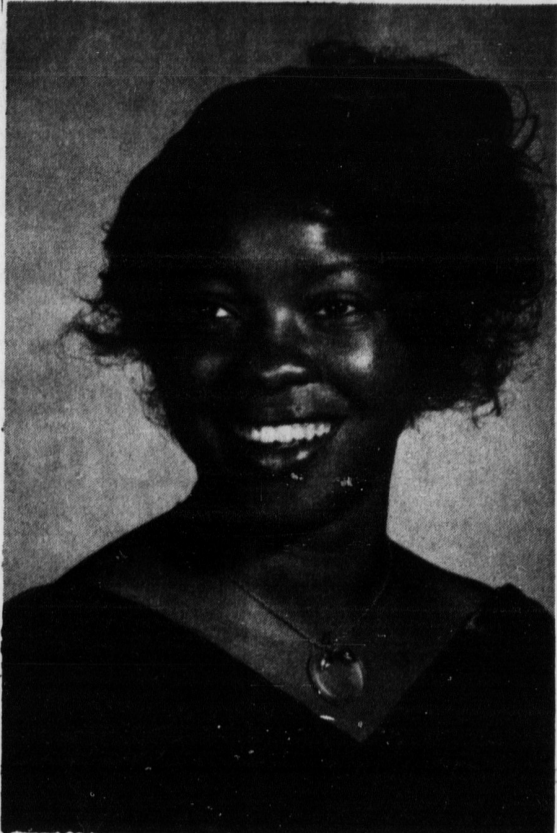
The invitation reads, "The love that began June 10, 1921 for William Grayson Early and Georgia Elma Ross, thought and shared to all the Earlys and Rosses".

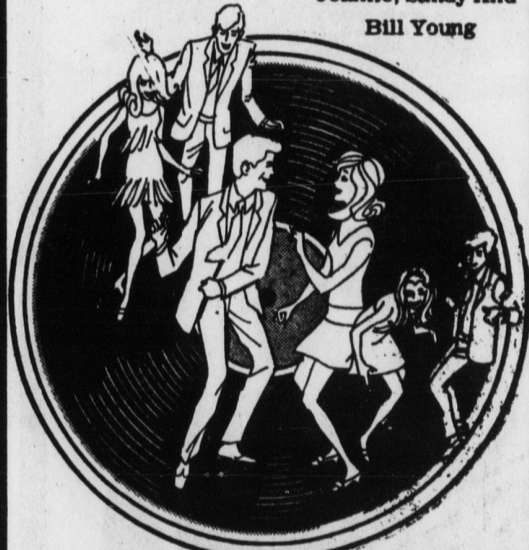
