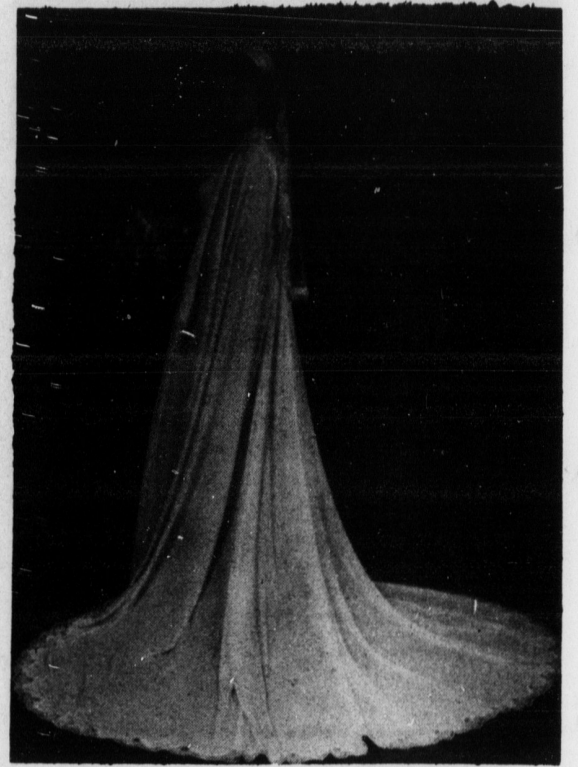
tinted to match their dresses. Lynn Huntsinger was flower girl and Michael Ball was ringbearer.

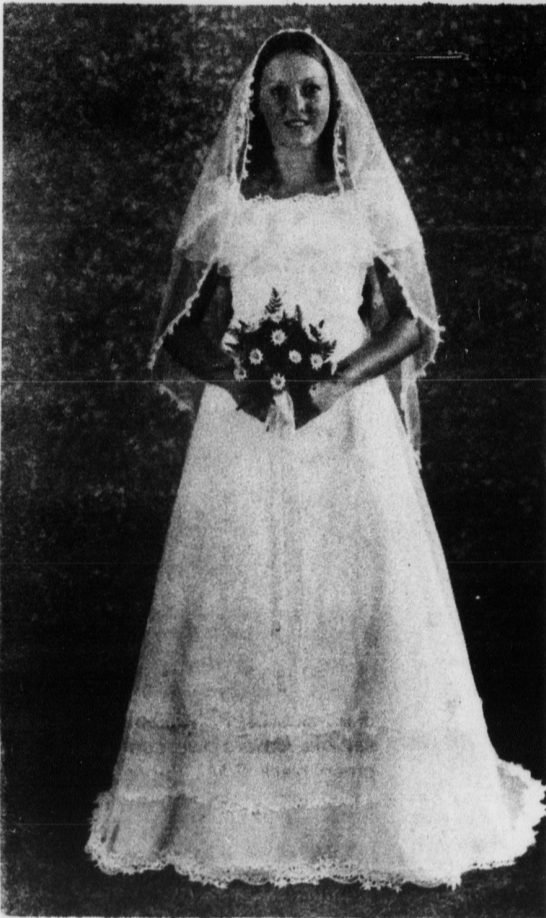
