1979-80 Kings Mountain School Bus Schedules

School buses will begin operation in the Kings Mountain School District on Fri., Aug. 31, (orientation day) and schools will operate on an 8:30-11 a.m. schedule for this day only. Tues., Sept. 4 will be the first full day of operation.

"Students planning to ride buses to schools should be ready to board buses by approximately 7-7:15 a.m. on August 31. The same policies and procedures utilized during the 1978-79 school year will be applicable until notice of change is issued." said Larry Allen, transportation director.

Beginning with the 1979-80 school year, Kings Mountain schools transportation will be serving the students with three different bus fleets. Fleet No. 1 will serve the elementary students, No. 2 will serve the Central students and No. 3 will serve the junior and senior high students.

Each elementary bus will follow the same general route descriptions as last year. Central School's and the jr.-sr. high school's bus routes have been altered to allow for smoother operation and more efficient use of school time, Allen said.


