### **Open House Is Held**

Open house for the newly established Career Development Center for Displaced Homemakers was held Monday, at the Cleveland Tech Annex, located in downtown Shelby.

State Senator, Helen Marvin, featured speaker, officially opened the Center for the State. Other dignitaries attending included Les Roark, Mayor of Shelby, Dr. James Petty, President of Cleveland County Technical Institute, Ms. Miriam J. Dorsey, Executive Director of the North Carolina Council on the Status of Women, and State Representative Edith Lutz.

The Career Development Center will work with 80 Displaced Homemakers within the next year. Displaced Homemakers are persons who have worked for years as homemakers and suddenly find themselves without means of support because of divorce,

separation, death, or disability of a spouse, and they must find jobs to support themselves.

The program will provide five weeks of vocational assessment, confidence building, personal and job counseling, job readiness, (interviewing techniques, and resume writing), career workshop, and physical fitness. In addition, the program will provide two weeks of subsidized job searching.

The Center is funded by the Comprehensive Employment and Training Act CETA and is administered by the North Carolina Department of Administration. The Center in Shelby, one of four in North Carolina, is coordinated by Cleveland County Technical Institute. The service area includes Mecklenburg, Lincoln, Rutherford and Cleveland


