consisting of Sertomans in the medical profession was selected by Lowell Schmidt, then International president, to study the possibility of a program to help persons handicapped in hearing or speech. To further study the needs and possible methods of aiding the hearing and speech handicapped, the Board of Sertoma International made special trips to New York and Washington, D.C., to confer

with the officials of the Deafness Research Foundation and the American Hearing Society. The Board enthusiastically decided that Sertoma Clubs should undertake to participate in the important field of providing assistance to the millions of children and adults handicapped by hearing and speech impairments. Speech and Hearing Clinics have been built, operated and staffed by the Sertoma Clubs of St. Petersburg and Sarasota, Florida, for several years. The Sertoma Club of Houston, Texas, founded the Houston School for Deaf Children and has operated it. Many other clubs have had successful projects in this field. The Sertoma Foundation has opened five communicative Disorders Centers dedicated to research and treatment of the multitude of communicative disorders.

The National Heritage, Service to Mankind Award and Hearing and Speech Programs

were the three major emphasis programs recommended by the Sertoma International Board of Directors to the clubs for community service sponsorships until July 1, 1971, when a fourth program was recommended. SERTEEN and COLLEGIATE SERTOMA Clubs are now being organized on high school or college campuses, or otherwise in communities, by Sertoma Clubs or by other SERTEEN or COLLEGIATE SERTOMA CLUBS. Membership is open to young men and women, with no

restrictions as to race, color, creed or religion.
