The setting for the exchange of vows was before two seven-branch candelabra, with the Unity Candles banked by green Schifferali.

The bride's gown was a formal design of white silk and needlepoint lace, with empire waist of lace and seed pearls, featuring a high Victorian neckline and long fitted sleeves, fastening at the wrist with scalloped lace. The full A-line skirt was sprinkled with lace motifs at the hemline, and featured a Chapel length train which was enhanced with a deep scalloped border of delicate embroidered lace. 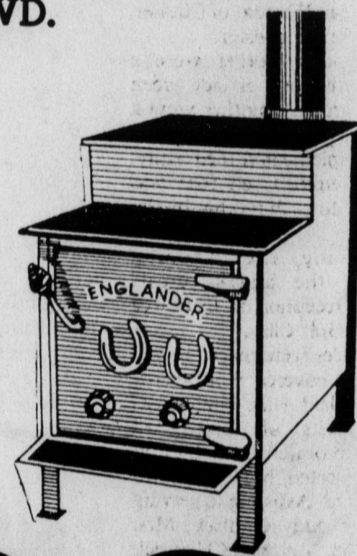
