

KMHS Students Selected

Six Kings Mountain students were chosen recently to represent Kings Mountain Senior High School at an exciting program in Washington, D.C. and will attend a Presidential Classroom for Young Americans.

Selected for their leadership qualities and academic standing were Dennis Raymond Caveny,

Theresa Jane Bumgardner, Robert Lee Smith III, Mark Franklin Smith, Pamela Hatch and Michael Craig Cornwell.

The young people will attend the various sessions beginning this week and concluding March 7th.

Presidential Classroom will give these students a firsthand look at how the Federal govern-

ment works. The rigorous, week-long schedule of seminars will take them to such centers of power as Capitol Hill, the Central Intelligence Agency, and cabinet departments. There they will talk with their representatives in the Congress and question many of the nation's leading political figures. They will also deepen their understanding of their fellow citizens by meeting high-school seniors and juniors from all over the country.

The students will see the cultural side of Washington as well. The Classroom's itinerary includes an evening at the theater or concert hall and visits

to the Smithsonian Institute and the National Gallery of Art.

At President Lyndon B. Johnson's recommendation, Presidential Classroom was chartered in 1968 as a nonprofit, nonpartisan educational program in the District of Columbia. This year, more than 400 high school students will attend each session of the Classroom.

One graduate of the 1980 program captured the Classroom experience by writing, "You read about politics and Washington in the paper. You watch it on television. You live it at Presidential Classroom."
