Junior High Drops Finale

Kings Mountain Junior High's wrestlers dropped a 35-29 decision to Sullivan Junior High of Rock Hill in their season's finale Thursday at the Central Gym.

The loss gave the Patriots a final duel meet record of 5-0 in the Western Junior High Athletic Association and 8-1 against all competition.

Sullivan's victory was its 135th in a row, which is a South Carolina State record.

"It was a heartbreaking loss for us," said Coach Phil Weathers of the Patriots. "But Sullivan has a strong team, as usual, and I have to give them a lot of credit."

"Our guys wrestled a heck of a match, and I really think it could have gone either way. It just happened to go their way."

The Patriots jumped out to an early lead but Sullivan won two of the last three matches to wrap up the victory.

"The teams were almost even," said Weathers. "If we could have won another decision anywhere along the way, we could have at least pulled off a tie. But our guys have done a good job this year and I can't say anything bad about them."

Kings Mountain's Mike Smith, a 135-pounder, completed a three-year unbeaten career at the junior high with a pin over previously unbeaten Bobby Gaston. Tim Hamrick, Dale Moore and Roger McClain also finished unbeaten seasons.

Weathers loses a host of talented ninth graders, including Smith, David Parker, Randy Whitaker, Calvin Goode, Moore, McClain, Hamrick, Robert Bradshaw, Todd Gossett and Rodney Ross.

"I really hate to lose them because most of them have been with me for three years," said Weathers. "But I hope to see them all wrestling on the high school level next year. I really enjoyed working with them."

from 6:30 until 9:30 at North School. Fee is \$8 for ages 18-up and free for senior citizens. Peggy McDowell will instruct.

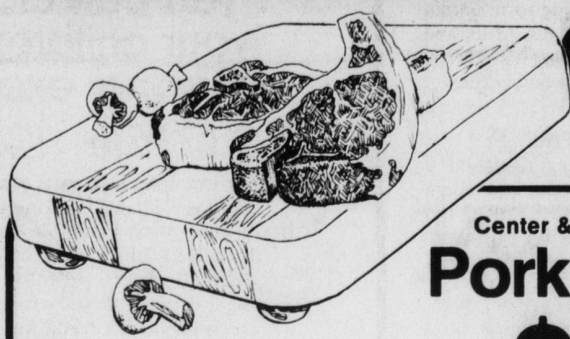
