## Energy Week Observed

Energy-conscious Ninth grade students completed a special study on energy and observed "Energy Education Week" by learning how to read meters from the experts.

Don Ellis, Gene Adair and Robert Smith, all of Duke Power Company's Shelby plant, demonstrated meters, meter boxes, and wiring and discussed "peak periods and hours" for a program last Wednesday before students in Phil Weathers' and David Harts' classes. The 350 students also saw demonstrations and the Duke Power officials brought a transformer and truck for the students to view after the program.

"Peaks occur when a customer is using the largest amount of electricity", said Ellis, and "peaks have become problems for us". "Up until 1975", said Ellis, "we were a summer peaking company and promoting the use of electricity. The more

we sold the cheaper the electricity became. Because of our generating capacities we want to eliminate these peak periods and encourage customers to avoid using major electrical appliances during the peak periods. Peaks hours during summer months are from 1 until 7 p.m. At this season peak hours are from 7 a.m. until noon," he said. "Duke Power Co. experienced a record peak on Jan. 8 of this year, a very cold day", he continued.
