Dr. Taylor T. Receive **Abbey Honorary Degree**

Belmont Abbey College will award Dr. J. Randolph Taylor, pastor of Myers Park Presbyterian Church of Charlotte, the honorary Degree of Laws degree. The presentation will be made during the 1981 commencement ceremony at Belmont Abbey College.

Taylor began his career as a minister in 1956 as pastor of The Church of the Pilgrims, Washington, D.C. In 1968 he became pastor of Central Presbyterian Church, Atlanta, Ga., where he served until his

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Clergy Association, commissioner of the Housing Authority of the City of Charlotte, and vice chairman of the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Community Relations Committee. He is a member of the Advisory Council to the Governor's Office of Citizen Affairs as well as the North Carolina Advisory Committee to the United States Commission on Civil Rights.

He is chairman of the General Assembly Committee on Presbyterian Union and of the Commission on Christian Unity, North Carolina Council of Churches. He serves on the executive board of the North Carolina

Taylor holds the bachelor of Arts degree from Davidson College, the bachelor of divinity from Union Theological Seminary, Richmond, Va., and the Ph.D. degree from the University of Aberdeen, Aberdeen, Scotland. In 1974 he was awarded the doctor of divinity degree from Oglethorpe Univer-

sity, Atlanta, Ga. His continued commitment to higher education is evidenced by his service on the Board of Trustees of Agnes Scott College, Decatur, Ga.; Davidson College,

Seminary, Interdenominational Theological Center, Atlanta, Ga.; and St. Andrews Presbyterian College, Laurin-

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burg, N.C. Born in Taichow, Kiangsu Province, China, Taylor is the son of Presbyterian missionaries, Dr. and Mrs. H. Kerr Taylor. He and his wife, the former Arline Johnson, have six children.

Taylor will receive his honorary doctorate from Belmont Abbey College at the 3 p.m. graduation exercises on May 10 in the Wheeler Center. One hundred forty-three graduates of the College will receive the bachelor's degree at


Butterflies Final Play
