

Foot Sales Increased


Foot Mineral Company reported net earnings of \$2,356,000 for the first quarter of 1981, compared with \$2,146,000 for the same period in 1980. After provision for preferred dividends of \$0.55 per preferred share, earnings per common share were \$0.29, compared to \$0.27 per share a year ago. Sales were \$48.2 million, compared with \$44.4 million in the 1980 quarter.

E.P. Comwer, President and Chief Executive Officer, said the higher earnings were primarily a result of good plant operations and increased sales.






