Carmet Lays Off Over 100

Because of a nationwide coal strike a temporary layoff at Carmet Company has affected more than 100 workers.

Carmet manufactures coal mining tools and Plant Manager Jerry Shook said the layoffs, which began on Monday, would last until progress is made in the strike negotiations. He said the approximately 130 employees will be called back to work when an agreement with the United Mine Workers representatives and the soft coal industry is reached. The strike is now in its 49th day.

Vice President and General Manager Jerry Schweiner said the company tried to postpone the layoff as long as possible. Three years ago the company did not lay off employees in a strike that lasted 110 days. "We're building too much inventory now at above prime interest rate," he said.

A country music benefit Saturday night at Crossroads Music Park will honor the late founder of the Park, Tom Brooks.

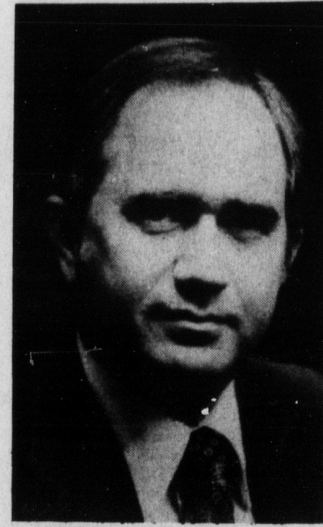
