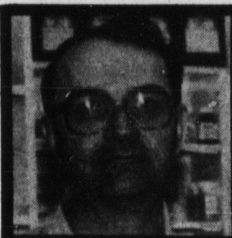

When your car is parked in the sun on a hot day, the temperature inside rises within minutes to dangerous heights. Anyone trapped inside may suffer heat exhaustion or heat stroke, either of which may be fatal. Children and older adults are most vulnerable; pets, too.

New research at the National Asthma Center in Denver suggests that asthmatics CAN exercise, as long as airways are kept warm and moist. Face masks that retain some of the moisture and heat of exhaled air seem to help.

One Italian physician reports that high-fiber diet seems to cut the incidence of angina attacks in the aged.

Should you wear glasses while watching TV? Yes, if you need correction for distances beyond two feet. (You shouldn't sit closer than that.) Vitamin C seems to help the body function in high heat, cutting down heat stress.
