### Thanks For Coverage

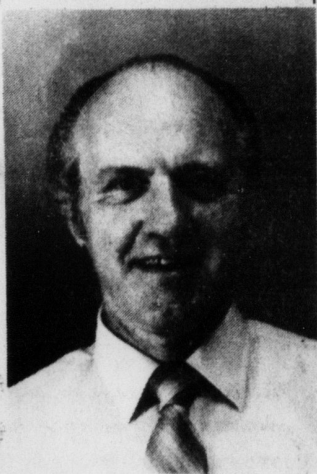
To The Editor:
