Mrs. Montgomery died Friday at Cleveland Memorial Hospital.

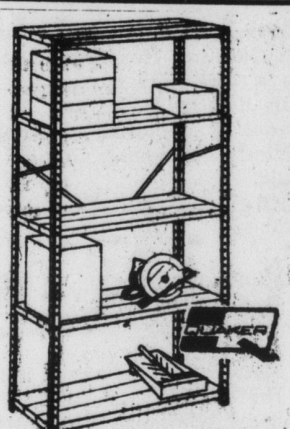
