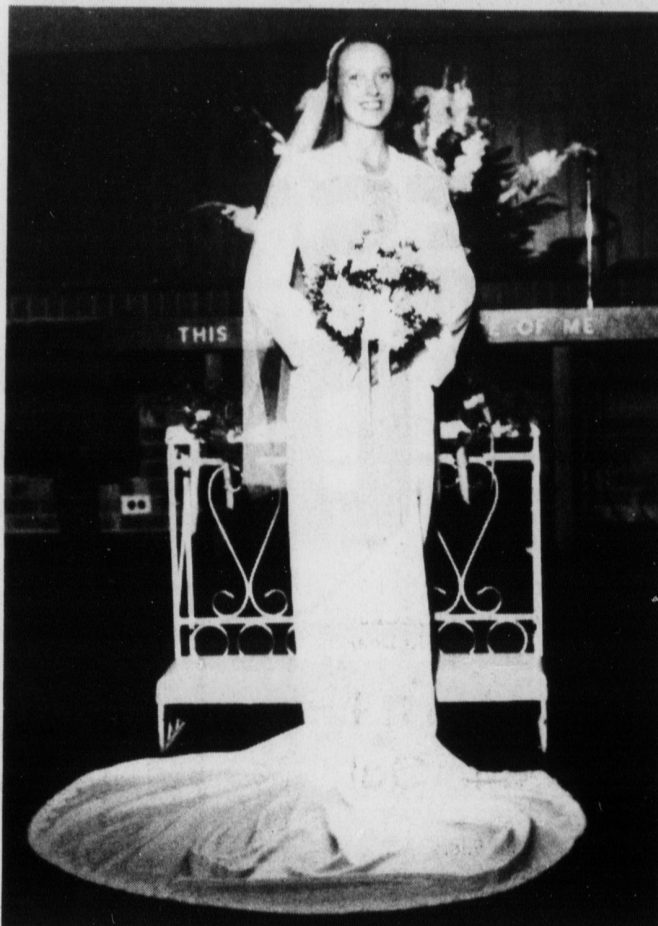

Laura Weldon, Tim McDaniel Wed Saturday At Oak Grove

Laura Kay Weldon and Timothy Scott McDaniel pledged their wedding vows Saturday at Oak Grove Baptist Church in Kings Mountain.

Rev. Mike Goudeock, pastor of Oak Grove Baptist Church, and Rev. Samuel Murphy, pastor of Bethlehem Baptist Church, officiated.

Marty Southards was organist for a program of wedding music. Vocalists were Lynn Echols and Mike Chambers. Mrs. Echols sang "The Wedding Song" and "The Wedding Prayer" and Mr. Chambers sang "If."

Lighted candles in the windows of the sanctuary banked with ivy and four seven-branched candleabra in the background provided the setting for the double-ring ceremony. Two cut flower arrangements of white glads, yellow mums, and bronze daisies set between the candleabra on stands and two smaller silk arrangements of similar colors highlighted by apricot rosebuds further enhanced the setting. A kneeling bench, with a unity candle to its side, was decorated by two large bows and two long stem red roses which were given to the mothers, formed the center of the setting. The family pews were also decorated with two large bows.

The bride was escorted to the altar and given in marriage by her father, Paul Travis Weldon. She wore a traditional gown of white organza designed with a high victorian neckline trimmed with venise and cluny lace. The full skirt was highlighted with a redingote front opening to a pleated organza insert and ruffle bordered with cluny lace. She wore a mantilla veil of English tulle bordered with lace scallops caught to lace calot and carried a Bible given to her as a child from her grandparents, and covered in a white lace Bible cover, topped with silk sweetheart roses, lily of the valley, tulle, star flowers, and baby's breath with a bridal satin bow and streamers tied with baby's breath at the ends. The center of her bouquet lifted out as a corsage.

Miss Paula Weldon, sister of the bride, served as maid of honor. She wore a formal gown of apricot polyester organza lined in acetate taffeta. The front held a side ruffle attached at the waist, which met a flared skirt with flounced hem. The gown was complemented with a detachable capelet of matching sheer polyester. She carried three long stem silk apricot roses with a satin bow and silk streamers.

Bridesmaids were Penny Marie Weldon of Kings Mountain, sister of the bride; Cynthia Louise McDaniel of Kings Mountain, sister of the groom; Cathy Lee McDaniel of Kings

Mountain, cousin of the groom; and Robin Nita Weldon of Griffin, Ga., cousin of the bride. They wore formal gowns of apricot polyester chiffon, featuring a scoop neckline and empire waistline. The gowns were highlighted by a ruffled capelet falling down the back from the shoulders. The ruffle also edged the scooped neckline in the front. They carried two long stem silk apricot roses with a satin bow and four streamers.

Dawn Jones was flower girl. She wore a gown of white dotted swiss, patterned with apricot and yellow roses, with an apricot ribbon at the waist. A small apron edged with lace accented the gown. She carried a small fire side basket enhanced with an apricot bow at the handle and similar flower petals filled the basket.
