Kings Mountain citizens will go to the polls Tuesday to elect three members of the Kings Mountain Board of Commissioners.

Since this is an "off" election year and the Mayor and other highranking city and county officials are not up for election, the vote is expected to be light.

The Herald has a long-standing policy of not endorsing candidates on the local level. We won't break that policy this year.

Fire Prevention Week

Next week is Fire Prevention Week across the United States. The Insurance Information Institute, in a new brochure entitled "Be Fire Smart. Tips for Home Owners and Renters" suggests many ways we can improve our own fire safety.

But here are some of the facts:

A home fire breaks out evey 45 seconds in the U.S., property damage runs into the billions and 7,500 lives are lost each year. Some things you can do to prevent fires in your home:

*Keep trash in covered containers and dispose of regularly. Paints, paint thinners and other flammable materials should be stored in their original containers and away from fire sources. Clean up following doit-yourself projects.

Don't overload circuits or use frayed electrical extension cords. Wiring should be checked by a good electrician periodically to make sure it isn't faulty.

*Use only fuses and circuit breakers bearing the Underwriters' Labratories (UL) label or antoher testing laboratory.

*Don't run an extension cord under a rug or behind curtains. Try to avoid letting large amounts of trash accumulate. Clean attics, basements, closets and garages often.

*If smoke detecters are battery-operated, the batteries should be checked often to make sure the unit is operatinal. Every home should have at least one smoke detector in the hallway leading to the bedrooms.

* Additonal smoke detecters should be considered, expecially if your home has more than one level. The smoke detecter's alarm may give your family precious extra minutes to escape, especially at night when most home fires occur.

*A family escape plan should sketch the layout of each floor, including the windows, doors and stairs. Every family member should be familiar with the layout. There should be two escape routes from each room and they should be marked clearly on the sketch. Frequent fire drills, including some at night, should be held so everyone will know what to do and be able to act quickly in an emergency. A family member should be assigned to help the elderly or very young escape. A meeting place should be designated outside the home and everyone should go there at once in case of a fire. Count heads, stay together and don't go back into the house for personal items.


