He contacted local industries and the top four participating were: Spectrum 23 donors; Mauney Hosiery 15; Anvil Knit 14 and Clevelmont 11. Plans are underway to change the day of this visit from Friday to Monday next year and the hours to 11:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

Special thanks are also due the Kings Mountain Jaycees for their help at four of the six Bloodmobile visits during the year. They provide help to unload and load the Charlotte Blood Center truck, the Cleveland County Red Cross van and help set up the site for each of the community visits except the two high school ones. The next visit to Kings Mountain will be held at Kings Mountain High School on Mon., Dec. 7. Please change this date on any schedule you may have.


