Six Kings Mountain women golfers competed in the Foothills Tournament last Tuesday at Lincoln Country Club.

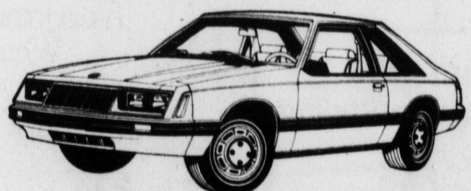

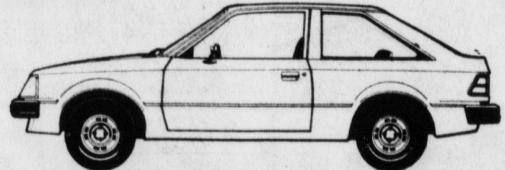
