Fourteen members fished. John Rankin of Shelby won first place honors and Tom Mayhew of Shelby finished second.


For the year, Mike Seawright of Kings Mountain was first in the overall point standings. John Rankin was second and Gary Smart third.

Arnold Ledford of Shelby caught the largest bass of the year. six pounds and one ounce. The members selected Joe Turner to receive the sportsmanship award.


Club officers for 1981 received special plaques. They included Turner, president; Rankin, vice president; Ledford, secretary-treasurer; and Smart, tournament director.
