CITY OF KINGS MOUNTAIN NORTH CAROLINA INVITATION TO BID

Sealed Proposals will be received by the City of Kings Mountain North Carolina, in the City Hall, in the City Clerk's office, Kings Mountain, North Carolina, until 2:30 P.M., January 28, 1982, at which time all bids will be publicly opened and all bid prices read aloud, for the following: material to build water pump system on North Piedmont.

No bid shall be considered or accepted by the City of Kings Mountain unless at the time of its filing, the same shall be accompanied by a deposit of cash or certified check on some bank or trust company insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation in an amount equal to not less than five percent (5%) of the proposal. In lieu of making a cash deposit, the bidder may file a bid bond executed by a corporate surety, licensed under the laws of North Carolina to execute such bonds, conditioned that the surety will, upon demand forthwith, make payment to the obligee upon said bond if the bidder fails to execute the Contract in accordance with the Bid Bond, and upon failure to forthwith make payment, the surety shall pay to obligee an amount equal to double the amount of the bid bond. This deposit shall be retained if the successful bidder fails to execute the Contract within ten (10) days after the award or fails to give satisfactory surety as required herein.

The successful bidder shall be required to enter into a Contract with the City of Kings Mountain in writing and shall be required to furnish bond on some surety company authorized to do business in the State, or make a deposit of money, certified check, or government sureties for the full amount of said Contract for the faithful performance of terms of said Contract as required in Section 143-129 of the General Statutes of North Carolina.

Baird Joins Eaton Engagement Announced

Mellon C. (Bud) Baird is joining Eaton Corporation as President of the company's newly formed Defense and Systems Group. The announcement was made by James R. Stover, President and Chief Operating Officer of Eaton. The new group has resulted from the restructuring of Eaton's Instruments & Diversified Products Group, whose Group President Arthur E. Morgan has resigned. The executive appointment and the new group are effective December 31, Stover said. Morgan will continue to report to Stover on special assignment.

Eaton's new Defense and Systems Group will consist of Semiconductor Equipment Operations and Instruments & Systems Operations and will employ some 4,200 persons. Included in the newly formed group will be Eaton's ALL Division, with plants in Deer Park, Melville and Farmingdale, N.Y.; Data Systems Services Division, Los Angeles; Electronic Instrumentation Division, with plants in Los Angeles and Santa Clara, Calif.; Ronkonkoma, N.Y. and Troy, Mich.; Ion Implantation Division, with plants

in Beverly, Mass. and Austin, Texas; Test Systems Division, with plants in Sunnyvale, Calif., Danbury, Conn., Woodland Hills, Calif.; and the Wafer Systems Division, with plants in Sunnyvale and Woodland Hills, Calif.

Stover said that the balance of the former Instruments and Diversified Products Group would be affiliated as follows: Specialty Products Operations will become part of the Industrial Products Group; Engineered Fasteners Operations and Controls Operations will become part of the Automotive Components Group.

"We are especially pleased that Bud Baird has joined Eaton," Stover commented. "The businesses which make up the Defense and Systems Group will benefit from his expertise and management experience."

Baird joined Eaton from Sanders Associates, where he has been a Director, Corporate Senior Vice President and President of the Federal Systems Group. Before joining Sanders in 1974, he was with Fischbach and Moore of Dallas, Texas where he served as President of F & M Systems Company and as Vice President--Marketing. From 1957 to 1963 Baird was employed with Varo, Inc., in several marketing and sales positions. He served in the U.S. Navy.

Baird received a BBA degree in 1956 and an MBA degree in 1960, both from North Texas State University in Denton, Texas.

Eaton is a manufacturer of advanced technology products serving worldwide industrial and transportation markets. Sales for the first nine months of 1981 amounted to \$2.4 billion and net income was \$58.7 million or \$2.15 per share. Earnings for the first nine months of 1981 were sharply reduced by a special charge in the first quarter of \$43.6 million or \$.88 per share. The charge related to Eaton's decision to close its Philadelphia plant, and to consolidate its North American life operations. Eaton employs 50,000 persons in 170 plants on six continents.
