\$1,246,741 from the Cleveland County Commissioners. That figure represents a 15 percent increase over the current budget. Supt. William Davis said much of the increase will go to cover automatic salary and benefit increases for 22 locally-paid teachers and for operation and maintenance of facilities. Three locally paid aide positions will be eliminated.

Davis said he anticipates revenues from local tax levies to increase because of expanded industries.

The system should also receive around \$70,000 from the Gaston County Board of Commissioners for Gaston County residents who attend Kings Mountain Schools.

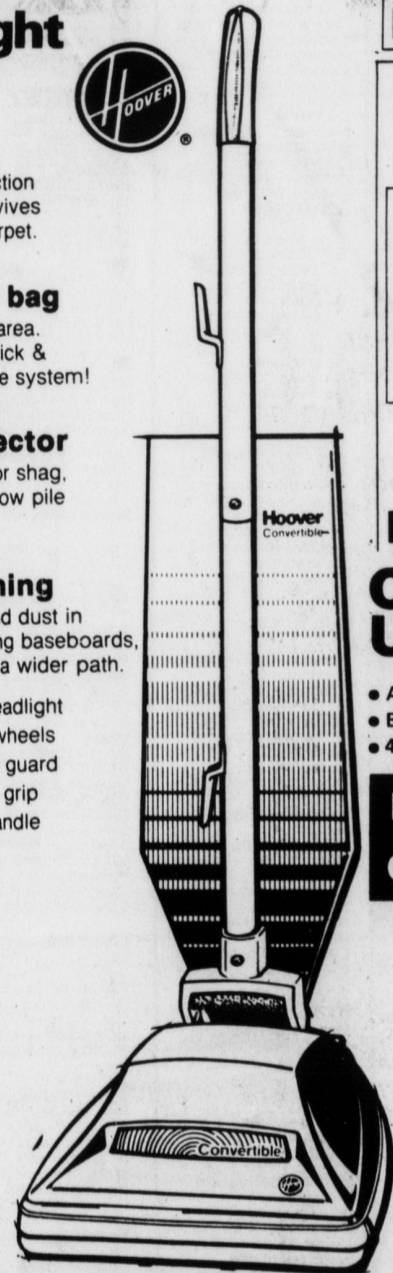

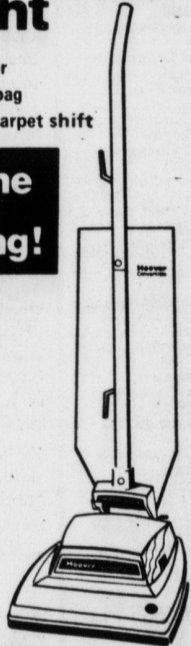

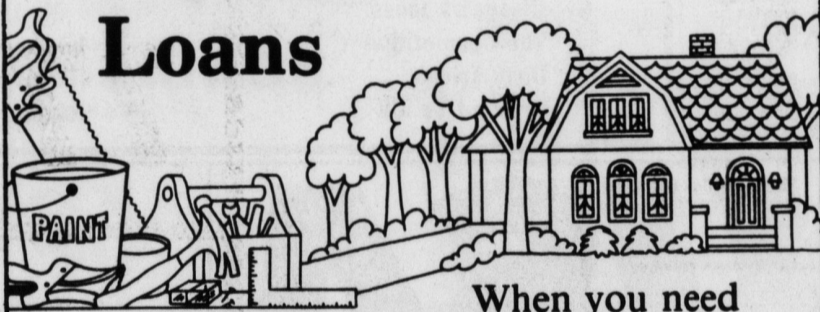
