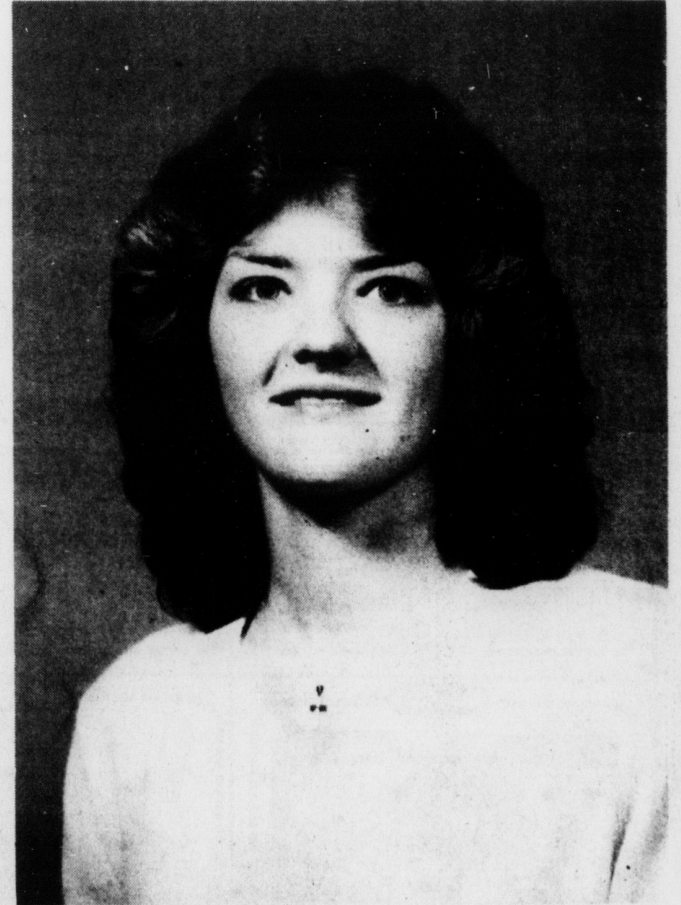
KIMBERLY JO PORTER
