A letter of intent has been signed by Stevens and Stevcoknit, under terms of which Stevens will acquire Stevcoknit's outstanding common stock. Stevens closed Thursday on the New York Stock Exchange at 171/8, up 1/2.

Conditions to which the transaction is subject includes Stevcoknit's reaching an agreement with representatives of the principal creditor groups for a satisfactory plan of reorganization by May 14, execution of a definitive agreement between Stevcoknit and Stevens, and final approval of Stevcoknit's plan by the U.S. Bankruptcy Court and the shareholders and creditors of Stevcoknit.

Stevens said that the proposed acquisition would strengthen its total knit business, "capitalizing on the company's expertise in spun yarns and natural fibers and employing under-utilized assets already in place."

Stevcoknit produces cotton and polyester/cotton knit fabrics for sportswear and outerwear and has dyeing and finishing and yarn production facilities. It has eight subsidiaries, including Park Yarn Mills of Kings Mountain.
