The cafeteria was decorated with green ferns, purple rhododendrons, and white ac-

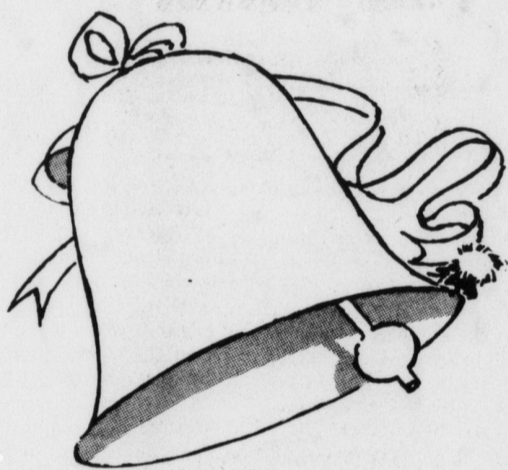
cessories. Giant red apples signifying Staff Appreciation Day were pinned on the staff members.
