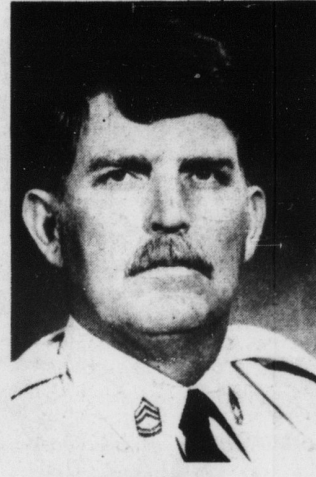


Assisting in the screenings were Cleveland County Mental Health, Kings Mountain

Woman's Club, First Baptist Church, Kings Mountain Lions Club, Harris-Teeter, TG&Y, and a host of volunteers.


Billie Farris of Kings Mountain prepared a hot lunch for all volunteers and the Kings Mountain Sertoma Club conducted the hearing screenings.

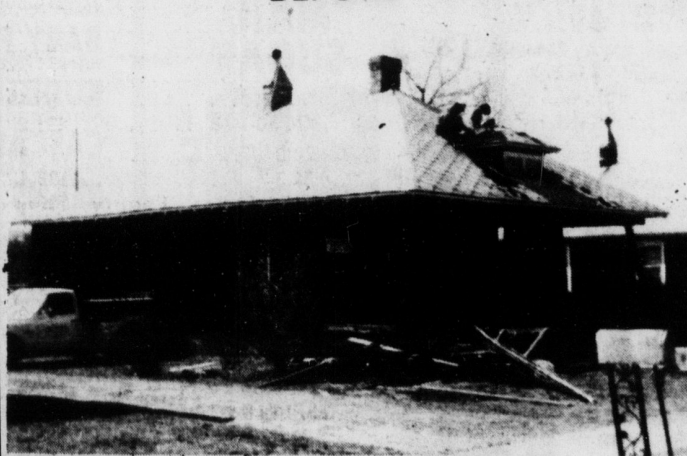
