(118) QUESTION: How much does the Social Security Board contribute for an individual under the old-age assistance law?

ANSWER: Public assistance is a State-Federal program, administered by the State, in accordance with the State law, and the amount given an individual is determined by the State. The Federal Government will match, dollar for dollar, the amount granted an individual by the State up to a maximum Federal contribution of \$15 a month, to a needy aged person.

(119) QUESTION: How much does the Social Security Board charge for filling a claim? ANSWER: The Board makes

no charge for receiving a claim nor for assisting a claimant. (120) QUESTION; Should a
