



Roy Wilkins Hits Liquor Industry's Sector Limitations Of Its Salesmen

NEW YORK (AP) — In a joint press conference, Roy Wilkins, executive secretary, NAACP, and Joseph Overton, president of the New York branch, called for "prompt negotiations" with the liquor industry for the development and implementation of an equitable system which totally disregards race in the assignment of sales personnel.

There are, according to Wilkins, 72 Negro liquor salesmen out of a total of 1,800 salesmen. With one rare exception, all the Negroes are confined to the Harlem area where even then they are restricted to certain accounts. On the other hand, white salesmen can sell wherever they please.

"The educational demonstrations," declared Wilkins, "are being used as a last resort."

"The salesmen have sought in vain, relief from the State Liquor Authority, the State Commission Against Discrimination, their union, had through previous negotiations with their employers."

As yet, no spokesman for the liquor industry has replied to the offer for negotiations.

The Board of Bishops also announced that Mrs. Alstork had been appointed to handle the affairs of the General Secretary-Auditor until the coming General Conference, which will be held in Buffalo, New York, May 1960.

According to the announcement, at the closing session, Metropolitan Wesley A.M.E. Zion Church, North Capital Street at R. Northwest, Washington, D. C., will be the scene of the Board of Bishops meeting in January, 1960.

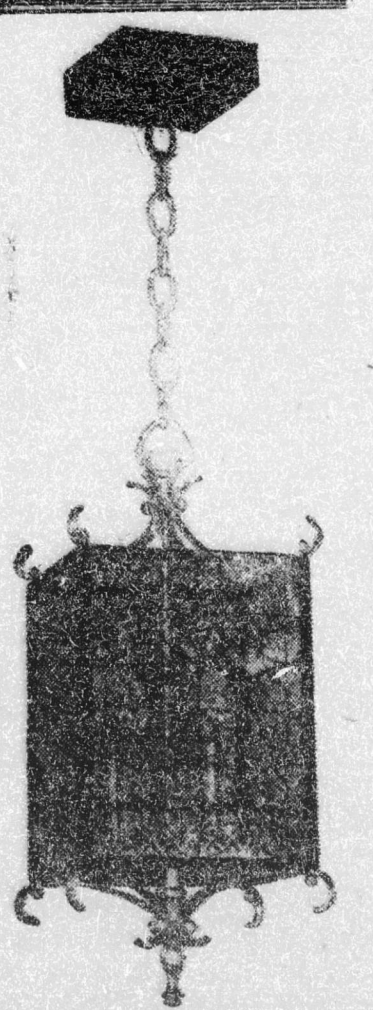
