The two surviving daughters of the 2 children of the late Haywood and Harriet Wilder of the Shotwell community near Knightdale sponsored a family reunion of the fourth generation of the original Wilder family. The two are Mrs. Seabrook Gatlin, 1519 E. Jones Street and Mrs. Adline Rand of 905 S. Blount Street.

Grandchildren, great-grandchildren, great-great-grandchildren, and other relatives and friends of the original family met to commemorate.

The Rev. C. C. Jones of 508 S. Blount, a close friend of the family, gave some highlights

of the family background and activities in previous years. He said that Mr. and Mrs. Haywood Wilder were members of the Good Hope Baptist Church near Knightdale some fifty years ago. Mr. Wilder was an ordained deacon of the church and wielded a strong Christian influence in the church as well as in the community.

The Wilders had twelve children. The following indicates how the family tree developed:
