## Washington, D. C. Trying To Prevent Juvenile Crimes

WASHINGTON, D. C.—In an effort to prevent juvenile delinquency, the Washington Juvenile Bureau has assigned police cruisers to keep an eye on teenage groups wherever they are found.

One gets a comprehensive view of the program by taking a glance at Police Cruiser 85 on a tour of duty last week. Its occupants were Pvt. Stanley Mizarek and Joseph Frelin, a Washington Star photographer, Francis Rouitt.

At 9:27 p.m., Police Cruiser 85 made a sharp turn on Nichols Avenue S.E. and stopped besides a darkened store. There stood eight teenagers.

Pvt. Mizarek leaped out and asked the boys what they were doing? When they made no reply, he and his partner frisked the boys for weapons. One pocket yielded a door chain, another a pocket knife.

"I'm taking you home, son," the officer said to the boy with the weapons. "I think you're heading for trouble."

From Cruiser 85 Washington has three other black, unmarked police sedans like Cruiser 85. They are assigned to the Juvenile Bureau.

"We look for idle groups of kids with too much time on their hands," Pvt. Mizarek, 32, explained.

"What we try to do is head them off before they get themselves in trouble."

Within the last few months, their task has assumed new importance. Roaming gangs of youths have used the cloak of darkness to rob, maim and destroy to a degree of viciousness that has shocked even veteran law enforcement officers.

The patrolling cars carefully appraise sidewalks, alleys, streets, and corners where dozens of youths are congregated to escape the heat

At Kennedy Street N.W., the officers spotted a trio of boys loitering beside a store. Just as the car approached, one of the boys pulled out a slingshot and flipped a stone at a passing street car.

Pvt. Mizarek was out of the car like a shot.

"Give me that," he commanded and the boy meekly surrendered it.

Needs a Law

Pvt. Mizarek states that the Police Department needs a law to support its efforts.

Inspector John Winters, head of the Metropolitan Police Youth Aid Division, says, "We need an anti-loitering law, and we look upon such legislation not as punitive but as a measure to be used primarily for the protection of children."

It is generally believed that a law of this kind would not restrict legitimate teenage activity or place a curfew on them, but "it would prohibit loitering and loitering in public places."

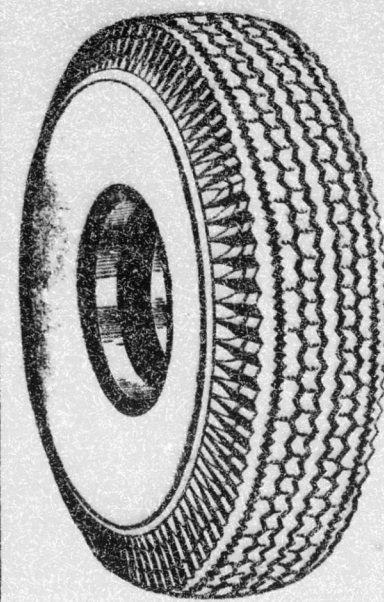
