## Livingstone Announces Plans For Its 78th Commencement

SALISBURY — A Harvard University trained educator and a distinguished minister of the A. M. E. Zion Church have been chosen speakers for the Seventy-Eighth annual Commencement at Livingstone College according to an announcement made by Dr. S. E. Duncan, president of the College.

Speakers for the Commencement period scheduled to begin on Friday, May 27, and conclude on Tuesday, May 31, are Dr. Clinton L. Wilcox, minister of the Centennial

AME Zion Church, Mt. Vernon, New York; and Dr. Robert C. Weaver, Consultant to the Ford Foundation, New York City.

Dr. Wilcox, a veteran minister of the Zion Church and graduate of Livingstone College, is a native of Alabama and has served parishes in Alabama, North Carolina, and New York. Known as church builder, he has led many of the parishes in constructing new edifices for worship and community service.

His present parish built a new church costing more than \$300,000 in 1949 and the membership has increased from approximately 400 to more than 1,200. He is active in religious, civic and educational affairs of his community where he serves on The Mayor's Committee, Civil Defense, Commission Against Discrimination for Westchester County and was the first Negro elected to membership in the Exchange Club, now the Optimist Club.

He has been greatly honored by his denomination and has given it effective representation on various occasions here and abroad. He was a delegate to the 1952 Ecumenical Methodist Conference at Oxford, England; and to the World Council of Churches which met at Evanston, Ill. in 1954. He represented his denomination at the World Methodist Conference at Lake Junaluska, N. C., in 1956, and at the 14th World Convention at the Aoyama Gakuin University, Tokyo, Japan, in 1958. Dr. Wilcox will preach the Baccalaureate Sermon on Sunday, May 29, at 3 p.m.
