2 Of 4 White D. C. Police Involved In Alleged Rapes, Turn In Their Badges

WASHINGTON (AP) — Two of the four white policemen recently acquitted of criminal rape charges on a Negro woman, have resigned from the police force. The policemen who were on suspension from the force since their arrest last February submitted their resignations while awaiting action for their reinstatement by the police trial board.

The other two are still facing administrative charges for improper police conduct.

FREED ON RAPE CHARGES
The four policemen were acquitted of rape and sodomy charges upon a 31-year-old domestic worker. The acquittal was made by District Court Judge George L. Hart, Jr., a few weeks ago, on the grounds of insufficient evidence.

In his ruling the judge emphasized that "this is not a police trial board," therefore, he was not ruling on "the fitness of these men to be on the police force."

On the same day of the policemen's resignations, the District Court dropped rape charges against William H. Smith, a Negro escort.

She claimed that the escort, who was a mere acquaintance, tore her undergarments off while driving her home from a party. While taking liberty with her, the policemen came up and shined their light in the car and she yelled "rape".
