NEW YORK, N. Y. — Jazz star, Miles Davis, and his famous troupe will be exclusive features of the gigantic Fifth Annual Randall's Island Jazz Festival on Sunday, Aug. 21st, producer, Franklin Galtman, announced today.

will perform at Randall's Island playing a special group of new themes especially composed for this event, the largest jazz festival in the world.

Anyway, the diminutive Negro entertainer was roundly booed when he appeared on the rostrum and was in tears when he returned backstage.

Sammy Davis, Actress Mai Britt Set October 1 As Wedding Date

BOSTON (ANP) — Sammy Davis, Jr. and his blond fiance, actress Mai Britt, will be married Oct. 1 in a ceremony in Davis' home at Los Angeles by a Jewish Rabbi, the Negro entertainer announced here recently.

Davis, 34, is a convert to the Jewish faith, Miss Britt, 24, is a Lutheran.

The announcement came as the Swedish beauty visited Davis at the Frolies at nearby Salisbury Beach on Massachusetts' north shore where he was completing a week's engagement.

Sammy said there won't be time for a honeymoon as he'll be too busy. Apparently the interracial marriage is hurting Davis socially in the United States as well as abroad. He was roundly booed last week when he appeared with other Hollywood stars to sing the national anthem at the opening of the Democratic national convention at Los Angeles.

Rock 'N' Roll Banned

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. (ANP) — In what he termed a move to prevent "gun-toters" and other "trouble makers" from jeopardizing the public, Mayor James W. Morgan of Birmingham last week angrily canceled jazz and "rock and roll" concerts at Municipal Auditorium on Sundays.

He acted after three Negroes were shot two of them seriously, during a "rock and roll" show at the auditorium recently. A Julius Williams was arrested and charged with the shooting. He claimed one of the victims, Charlie Harris, 21, provoked him and he became angry and started shooting. Bullets from his pistol also struck Miss Jessie Mae Jones, 17, and another glanced off the toe of Miss Dorothy Bonner, 16.

In canceling the Sunday shows, Mayor Morgan warned that he may go even further and cancel all weekend shows if such disturbances recur.

As the bullets rang out, there was panic in the jam-packed audience. Everywhere, fans were scrambling for cover. Police later moved in and canceled the show.

Police said the youths apparently decided to drive along the roads and dump the jewelry after they discovered the most of it was monogrammed with the singers' initials.
