

Student Council Passes A

The resolution was prepared by

CORE to get the University to make an active and explicit policy that all off-campus housing units approved by the University may no longer discriminate on the basis of race, color or creed."

The CORE resolution called upon the Office of Student Affairs to appoint a committee to receive and udge complaints of discrimination. All complaints must be in writing and signed by the person suffering

If the landlord is found guilty of discrimination, the unit will be withdrawn from the approval list. At the end of the semester, all undergraduate students living in the housing unit shall be required to move The landlord will not be allow ed to rent rooms to students for two full semesters after all students have left.

Milton Powell, president of lov City CORE, said: Iowa City CORE pursuing its goal of equal rights for all people regardless of race color, creed supports this resolu tion." The CORE group has bee working for some months to end housing discrimination.




