

Dr. John Hope Franklin Lectures At Del. State

DOVER Del.—The library committee and the library staff of Delaware State College presented Dr. John Hope Franklin in a lecture as the first feature of the 1960-61 Library Cultural Series recently.

Dr. Franklin, who returned from a State Department sponsored trip to Nigeria in October, talked on Independent Nigeria, Problems and Prospects. Miss Alice A. Jackson, librarian introduced the speaker who described the beauty, solemnity and impressiveness of the Nigerian Independence Ceremonies.

He also discussed the culture, educational situation, and economic structure of the country. Dr. Franklin concluded by pointing up the promise for Nigeria as an independent nation, in spite of its several problems.

Students, faculty members and friends participated in the question-answer period. At the reception which followed, Mrs. Joseph N. Grant and Mrs. E. Preston Mitchell presided over the tea table. Dr. Stephan Benda is chairman of the library committee.

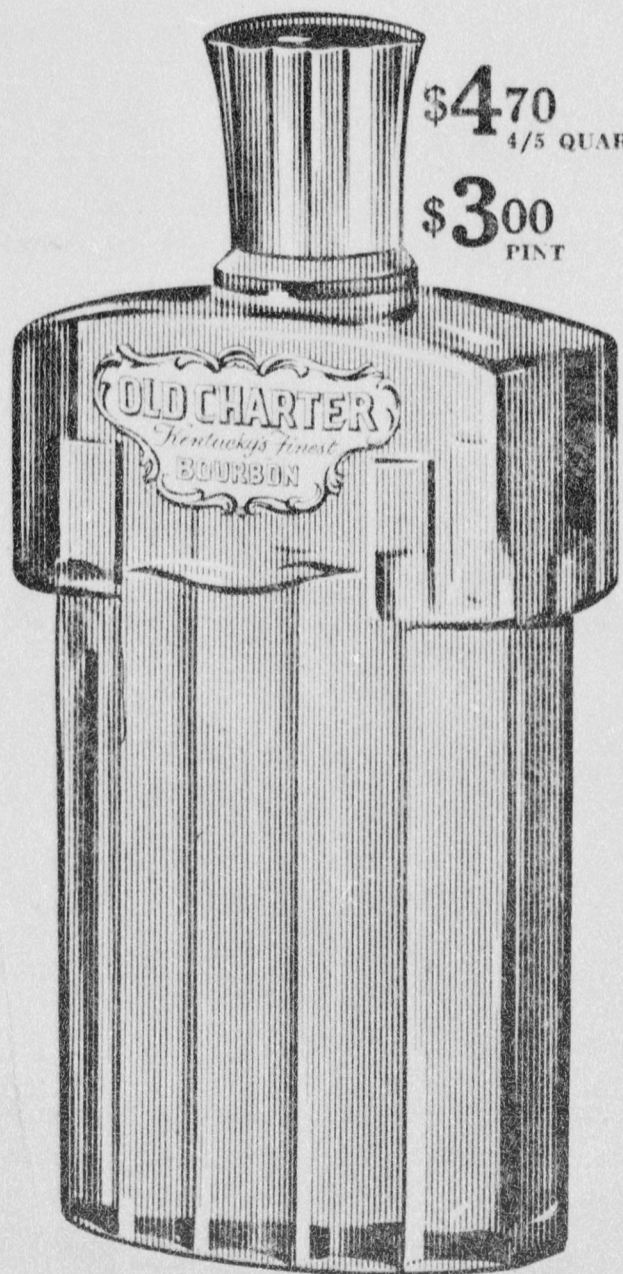

FAYETTEVILLE — "Among the Institutions of Higher Learning to acquire membership in the Southern Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools at its Twenty-Seventh Annual Conference in Memphis, Tennessee, recently was the Fayetteville State Teachers College," reported President Rudolph Jones who was present at the sessions.

Membership in the Southern Association means that graduates from the Fayetteville institution may now be accepted without condition to graduate schools throughout the country. Fayetteville was one of the seven Negro colleges admitted to full membership. The theme of the three-day ses-

Student Council Passes A Housing Anti-Bias Policy

IOWA CITY, Iowa—A resolution against discrimination in off-campus housing was passed by the Student Council of the State University of Iowa at the request of CORE.

The resolution was prepared by CORE to get the University to make an active and explicit policy that all off-campus housing units approved by the University may no longer discriminate on the basis of race, color or creed.

The CORE resolution called upon the Office of Student Affairs to appoint a committee to receive and judge complaints of discrimination. All complaints must be in writing and signed by the person suffering the discrimination.

If the landlord is found guilty of discrimination, the unit will be withdrawn from the

approval list. At the end of the semester, all undergraduate students living in the housing unit shall be required to move. The landlord will not be allowed to rent rooms to students for two full semesters after all students have left.

Milton Powell, president of Iowa City CORE, said Iowa City CORE pursuing its goal of equal rights for all people regardless of race, color, creed supports this resolution. The CORE group has been working for some months to end housing discrimination.
