Subtle Form Of Racial Roadblock Is Reported

LOS ANGELES (ANP)—Actors and other members of the cast of "Raisin In The Sun," the successful Broadway play on Negro life authored by Lorraine Hansberry, ran into a subtle form of racial roadblock in their attempt to acquire housing accommodations here prior to the opening of the play at the Huntington-Hartford Theatre, December 20, it was reported.

According to the Los Angeles Eagle, weekly newspaper, a representative for the group of actors was experiencing suspicious if not downright bias in trying to arrange reservation for the groups. The agent arrived here ahead of the theatre group.

The subtle bias, the Eagle said, is the first such experience for the troupe since it hit the road. The group has played Boston, Pittsburgh, Philadelphia, Detroit, Denver, Toronto and even Baltimore and found hotel doors open to them.

Even small Los Angeles hostilities that usually jump at the opportunity to house Huntington-Hartford players are "all booked up," the agent reported. He said he took into account the coming Christmas holiday and the Rose Bowl game, but still thought there was something fishy about the housing situation here.

He said he checked a total of 10 hotels, for instance, and got the brushoff. One manager seemed "delighted" when informed the rooms requested were for Huntington-Hartford actors until he learned the play was "Raisin in the Sun." He then quickly raised the old cry, "booked solid."
