SAN JUAN, Puerto Rico (ANP) - Smooth-singing Johnny Mathis struck a somewhat discordant note with officials of Puerto Rrico's biggest nightclub last week when he walked off in the middle of his \$15,000-a-week act because a heckler in the packed audience had made an insulting remark.

In what was described as a crackdown on temperamental artists the Club Tropicoro fired Mathis and threatened a lawsuit against Sammy Davis, Jr.


