State College Hints

HELPFUL HOUSEHOLD HINTS
 —Paint wicker furniture with a fly sprayer. Make paint very thin. It's easier and covers more evenly than a brush. Several coats may be needed.
 —When painting wear a pair of old socks over your shoes, keeps paint off shoes socks will absorb drops you step on, which saves tracking.
 —If you want to hurry the drying of clothes indoors, turn on the electric fan. Air circulated will dry them faster.
 —When ironing fringed edges, use a small scrub brush and brush and iron.
 —To remove tiny bits of animal hairs and lint from clothing, wrap a piece of scotch tape around your hand with sticky side out. Carry a small roll of tape in your bag for a quick brush before going into meeting.
 —When your telephone rings, don't cause an accident by breaking your neck to answer it. If the call is important they will call back. Accidents frequently occur while hurrying to the telephone.
 —Your embroidery or knitting thread won't get tangled if you wind it on hair curlers. The clasp holds the thread in place.
 —If you perspire freely, try throwing a handful of soda into your bath water. You will like its refreshment.

Radar Safety

Safety records show that driving on modern superhighways is monotonous and often causes the motorist to unconsciously exceed the speed limit. To prevent this, a new electronic safety device is available which "beeps" to let the driver know he's approaching a radar zone, thus alerting him to slow down. Called Radar-Gard, the device operates on two per cent batteries, good for 35,000 miles of driving. Volume of beep is adjustable, according to manufacturer, Motorola Industries, 200 N. Dearborn Ave., Chicago.

Six Quit Jobs Rather Than Spray Demonstrators With Insecticide

NASHVILLE (ANP) — An interracial group of demonstrators was sprayed with insecticide when they refused to leave a white motel dining room here last week.
 Six Negro employees walked off their jobs at 89'er Inn rather than follow an order to spray insecticide on the protesting group, predominantly composed of Negro youths of the NAACP youth council and four adults including a white doctor, his wife, and a white student priest.
FORCED OUT BY FUMES
 The incident occurred after the group had sat in the dining room of the Inn for about 2 1/2 hours. Mrs. Clara Luper, NAACP youth mending service, according to advisor and one of the demon-

strators. She said the fumes from the spray forced them out of the dining room of the motel.
 Local branch president E. Melvin Porter said the incident "calls for the whole community to be present" at a meeting last week where the six quitting employees were featured speakers.
 Negroes quitting in face of the order were houseman Willard Corbin, and maids Nora Pitts, Dorothy West, Lizzie Turner, Henry-

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
