Policemen Suspended For Conduct

CHICAGO (AP) — Two South Chicago policemen, suspended for 29 days, have denied charges conduct unbecoming police officers with two women in a hotel here.

Paul Williams, 31, and Ned Tarver, 30, who reportedly took two women to a hotel while off-duty, were brought under investigation when one of the women involved in the case complained that she had been raped by one of the policemen.

The woman later retracted the charge, and both women reportedly admitted they had been drinking.

The policemen admitted being in company of the women, but denied any wrong conduct. However, the probe by the Internal Investigation Division revealed that Williams had registered at the hotel under a false name.

Consequently, both officers have been suspended on charges of conduct unbecoming a police officer and with filing a false report.

Both policemen are married. Williams has been on the force since October, 1954, while Tarver has been an officer since October 1960.

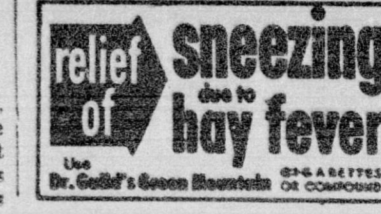
