Father Hicks Speaks At Bennett

GREENSBORO — The tendency of some individuals to look upon marriage as an institution in which one may try "two, three or four times" for success was deplored by the Rev. Richard L. Hicks, Jr., in the first vesper service of the New Year at Bennett College Sunday.

Rector of the Episcopal Church of the Redeemer here, Father Hicks said that Christian marriage has lost all of its validity with modern man because man has failed to realize that even mutual love is not necessarily a guarantee of success in marriage.

"Man must realize that fidelity, character, patience, forgiveness, humility and kindness are needed for a happy marriage. Woman was not created to be a domestic drudge or a toy to be cast aside. The partners in a successful marriage need to appreciate each others efforts, share each others interests and enrich each others lives.

"Marriage often fails," he continued, "because of the failure to recognize the difference between sexual attraction and romantic love. The former seeks to use the object of affection while the latter seeks to idealize it."

Bennett Gets \$100,000 Grant

GREENSBORO — Bennett College has received a grant from the Z. Smith Reynolds Foundation of Winston-Salem of \$100,000 for an expansion program. This announcement was made by President Willa B. Player.

The grant was a part of nearly \$2 million in gifts to colleges and hospitals in North Carolina made by the foundation at the close of the year.

In announcing the grant, Dr. Player said: "We hope that with this assistance we will now be able to erect a badly-needed health and physical education building, probably in the fall."

Also included in Bennett's capital improvement plans are a classroom building and an infirmary. A new \$400,000 residence building—Cone Hall—was dedicated in Oct.

NC Dairymen Go Back To School

Tar Heel Negro dairymen will go back to school for three days soon at A&T College in Greensboro.

The occasion is the 14th Annual Dairy Production Short Course, to be held Jan. 31-Feb. 2. It will feature speakers from A&T and North Carolina State College, the dairy industry in North Carolina and the Federal Extension Service in Washington.

The opening day will feature demonstrations and discussions. Thursday there will be talks on a variety of dairy topics and a banquet. A. S. Bacon of the Federal Extension Service will speak on

Rural Areas Development and the Dairyman. Chief speaker at the banquet will be L. L. Ray, Director of Developments at State College, with L. C. Dowdy, acting president of A&T as toastmaster.

Friday will be devoted primarily to talks on financing of dairies and production of manufacturing milk. R. E. Jones, who heads the extension program at A&T, will give the closing speech.

Lumberton Man Charged With Murder

LUMBERTON — James Frank McLellan, 24, has been charged with the murder of Benjamin William Barnes, 82, at Barnes'

home. McLellan is being held without bond. Barnes, before dying at South-eastern General Hospital, said a

man came to his home and asked to buy wood and coal. When he replied he did not sell fuel at night, McLellan pulled a pistol and shot him.

Assistant Chief of Police W. C. Lovett said McLellan had been terrorizing the community with his pistol, having threatened several persons before firing the fatal shot.

The pistol was recovered and is said to have matched the 22 caliber bullet extracted from Barnes' body.




