A Drake graduate, Mrs. Clinton
is the wife of M. S. Clinton, also
a Drake graduate. They are par-
ents of an 11-year-old son, Jer-
ome Boyd, who plays flute and
piccolo in the elementary school
band. Both Mr. and Mrs. Clinton
hold the distinction of being one
of the few husband-wife teams
working as clerks in the Des Mo-
ines postal system.

Mrs. Clinton's first fiction con-
tribution in the writing field is a
mystery and is being published by
Christopher House, in Boston.

Hampton Grad Returns To Give Concert

HAMPTON, Va. — Appearing be-
fore a small but enthusiastic audi-
ence, Miss Joanna Owens, soprano,
an alumna of Hampton Institute,
presented her homecoming per-
formance in the Institute's Ogden
Hall last week.

Singing fourteen numbers, rang-
ing from Brahms' Lullaby, through
excerpts from Verdi's "La Travi-
ta" to Negro Spirituals, Miss Owens
exhibited well the vocal form that
earned the praise of New York cri-
tics. She returned for three curtain
calls.

Miss Owens is a 1956 graduate of
Hampton's division of music. She
taught voice and music appreciation
at Clark College, Atlanta, Ga., for
a year following graduation and
toured Europe with the Harold
Nicholas musical, "Free and Easy",
in 1959.

Studying further under Robert
McFerrin and Madam Lotte Leon-
ard of the Julliard School of Music,
New York, Miss Owens has ap-
peared with the Mannes College
Opera Theatre. She appeared in
concert at New York's Carnegie
Hall in February of 1962.

St. Augustine's Gets NSF Grant For Math Institute

Dr. James A. Boyer, President of
Augustine's College, announced
that the National Science Founda-
tion has provided the College with
a grant of \$5,440, to support an In-
service Institute in Mathematics
for Secondary School Teachers of
Mathematics, under the direction of
Jeffery Gipson, Chairman of the
College's Chemistry Depart-
ment.

Dr. Boyer pointed out that this
is the second successive grant that
the College has received to conduct
In-Service Institutes for the 1962-63
school year. Earlier in the Spring,
the College received a grant to
support an In-Service Institute in
Mathematics for Elementary Teach-
ers for the 1962-63 school year. The
In-Service Institute for Sec-
ondary School Teachers is to get
underway September 22, at an off-

campus center to be announced at
a later date.

The Program will enable the Col-
lege to provide tuition-free grants,
plus travel and a \$10 book allow-
ance to thirty qualified teachers.
Participants will also be provided
a travel allowance at the rate of
seven cents per mile within a fifty-
mile radius.

Dr. P. R. Robinson, Dean of In-
struction, in commenting on the
grant indicated that its objectives
are: (1) To select those applicants
whose background training and ac-
ademic records indicate the need
for further formal training in mathe-
matics. (2) To drill the partici-
pants in the fundamentals of mathe-
matics. (3) To emphasize funda-
mental principles and relationships
with a view toward fuller compre-
hension of these, and (4) To dis-
cuss these fundamentals in relation-
ship to the every day classroom
teaching experience of the partici-
pants.

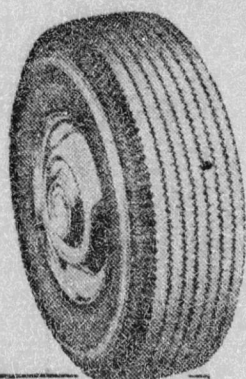
