Veteran Officer Gets Top Police Post In N. Y. City

NEW YORK (NPI) - Close on the heels of the charge by New York State Sen. Basil A. Patterson that city police have delayed the appointment of Negroes to positions of rank came the announcement that a veteran of 25 years' service, Lloyd C. Sealy, native New Yorker, had been elevated to the post of deputy inspector.

Patterson had charged that only five or six -- or 1,500 among 27,000--per cent of the department's ranking posts were manned by Negro officers.

Livingstone Given Loan Of 563G's

SALISBURY -- Livingstone College has been granted a loan of \$563,000 for construction of a new science building, additions to the Carnegie Library and the Trent Gymnasium, and to build a new social science-communications building by the U.S. Department of Health, Education and Welfare, according to an announcement made Tuesday in Washington, D. C.

Total cost for the project will be 1,363,245, according to Dr. S. E. Duncan, president of the church-related college.

Local architect Robert Stone is now completing plans for the buildings, Dr. Duncan said, and construction should begin within four months. It is expected that some of the buildings will be empleted within 12 months after bids are let.

This work, the college president said, is part of the second half of the 10 - year, \$6,000,000 Development Program upon which the college embarked in 1960, and which is scheduled to be completed during the 1969-70 school year, Total cost of the second phase of the special development program is expected to cost \$3,500,000 and will include two dormitories which will enable the student enrollment to increase to 1,000.




