Palmer, executive secretary, North Carolina Teachers Association, have been selected as members of the thirty-three membered delegation of the National Education Association of the United States to attend the World Conference of the Teaching Profession's (WCOTP) International Convention in Seoul, Korea, July 28-August 9, 1966.

Among the delegation will be Mrs. Elizabeth (Libby) Koontz, president of the Department of Classroom Teachers, NEA; Richards D. Batchelder, president of the National Education

Association; Dr. William Carr, executive secretary of the National Education Association, and others.

The theme of the 1966 Assembly is "The Role of Teachers Organizations in Educational Planning."

Sir Ronald Gould of England is president of WCOTP. Dr. Louise Yim of the Korean Federation of Education Association and President of Chungang University in Seoul, is President of the host organization for the 1966 WCOTP Delegate Assembly.
