SMITHFIELD - Approximately 160 county cured hams and 125 dozens of eggs are expected to be exhibited at the Nineteenth Annual Johnston County Ham and Egg Show and Sale which will be held at the Johnston County Agricultural Building in Smithfield, April 13 and 14.

The Show and Sale is sponsored jointly by the Smithfield Chamber of Commerce and the Agricultural Extension Service. The event will be highlighted by a Public Auction Sale Thursday, April 14, at 2 p. m. with C. B. "Snokie" Stephenson, auctioneer. Free ham biscuits

and cokes will be served and a drawing will be held for a county cured ham and ten dozen eggs which will be given to lucky ticket holders.

Registration of hams and eggs will be held Wednesday, April 13, from 9 a. m. to 11 a. m. Judging begins at 11 a. m.

The Awards Banquet will be held Wednesday, April 13, at 7 p. m. and will feature the 1966 4-H Talent Winners, Exhibitions, Chamber of Commerce members and their wives, program participants and special guests are expected to attend the banquet. Sponsors for the banquet are Carolina Packers, Inc., First Citizens Bank and Trust Company, First National Bank, Smithfield

The exhibit hall will open to the public Thursday, April 14 from 9 a. m. to 1 p. m.

The show is open to all residents of Johnston County who produce the products they exhibit. Hams may be entered from 10 to 22 pounds. All hams must be sugar cured and smoked. Eggs may be entered in medium, large or extra large classes.

The objective of the Show and Sale are: To encourage producers of hams and eggs to sell top quality products. To provide training and experience for producers which could result in commercial usage. To establish and promote Johnston County labeled products. To establish and maintain a vital and desirable relationship between Agriculture producers, the business community and consumers. 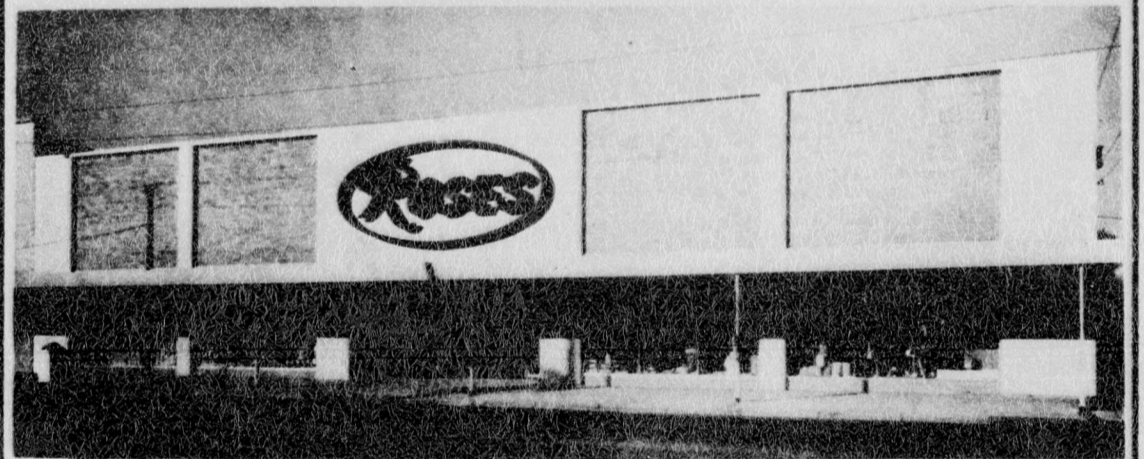
